CHANGES IMPACTING YOUR BUSINESS

Restaurants may begin opening with certain regulations in accordance with the regulations set forth in the Open Texas plan and Executive Order issued by Governor Greg Abbott.

- Restaurants identified by the TABC as operations with 50% percent or less in alchohol sales may open for dine-in service up to 25% of the total listed occupancy of the restaurant. Separate occupancy numbers exist for patios.
- Restaurants may not offer valet services except for vehicles with placards or plates for disabled parking.
- Restaurants that are licensed by TABC that display the 51% sign are still closed to dine-in services.
- Restaurants may continue to provide to-go or delivery services.
- Restaurants may adopt additional protocols consistent with their specific needs and circumstances to help protect the health and safety of all employees and customers.
- Tables must be no less than six feet apart.
- Parties are limited to no more than six in number at a table.
- Alcoholic beverages may only be purchased with food.
- Any seating used in bar areas for dining must comply with social distance and spacing guidelines.
