

The Little Elm Economic Development Corporation now owns the building formerly home to Hula Hut at 210 E Eldorado Parkway. After thoughtful discussion and direction from both the Economic Development Team, Board of Directors, and Town Council, the decision was made to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to explore new opportunities for the space.

This process invites interest from developers, brokers, contractors, and restaurant operators, allowing a range of potential concepts to be considered. An RFP is a formal process often used to gather proposals and ideas from experienced professionals.



Little Elm is growing fast, but we're growing with purpose—and we believe that makes a difference.








Anchored in Community Since 2003


Tucked into the heart of Little Elm's lakefront, Cottonwood Creek Marina has been part of the town's growth story for over 20 years. When the marina opened in 2003, it was a quiet operation with just over 100 slips. Today, it's home to nearly 400 and continues to evolve—just like the community it serves.

"We've been fortunate to grow alongside Little Elm," shared the Owner Ryan Miller. "From expanding our slips to added amenities, like boat rentals and the Nautical Boat Club, our goal has always been to offer a quality lake experience that keeps families coming back."

Customer service is at the core of their success. The team has recently expanded parking, upgraded the trailer storage facility, remodeled the ship store and bathrooms, and added new slips to meet growing demand. But it's not just about the amenities—it's the people behind the scenes. "As a small family business, we rely on energetic, dedicated staff. Our crew takes pride in caring for every dock and vessel. That care shows."

Summer marks their busiest season, and Cottonwood Creek Marina doubles its team size—often hiring local students. But even in the hustle, their commitment to community never wavers. "We support local and international causes year-round. One of our favorite events is Fuel for Folds. Over the Fourth of July weekend, we donate all fuel sale profits to Folds of Honor. We're aiming to top \$10,000 this year.

The marina's relationship with the Town of Little Elm runs deep. "The Parks Department, EDC, and Tourism team have always been great partners," Ryan said. "Little Elm is a lake town through and through, and we love being part of its story."
